

Allean Brown Shell affectionately known as "grandma" or "Ms. Shell" was born January 22, 1931 to the late Elihue and Rosa Brown in Edgefield, SC, the youngest of eight siblings. She was educated in the Edgefield County Public School District and later relocated to Washington, DC, where she obtained her high school diploma in the District of Columbia Public School system.

From an early age, she was raised in church. Allean developed a liking for music; she loved singing and playing many different instruments. However, she took a special interest in playing the piano.

In 1948, Allean migrated to Washington, DC on a bus with a ticket her sister purchased for her birthday. She never wanted to return to SC after that. She decided to perfect her craft by attending the Modern School of Music of Washington, DC.

In 1949, she met her husband, Casper Lee Shell, and welcomed their one and only, Nena in 1951. They were married 53 years until his passing, April 19, 2005. They joined New Canaan Baptist Church where she was a member for over 40 years. During her time there, she was the Lead Minister of Music, where she led the Choral Ensemble and Victory Choir.

She was a pillar of her community. She lived on the corner of Fort Davis Street for over 60 years. Allean was known for her beautiful flowers throughout the yard, her vegetable garden in the back or when too many people were sitting on her front porch and her cutting on the infamous porch light. She will truly be missed.

In 1972, Allean accepted a District of Columbia Public School position as a baker at Spingarn Senior High School where she worked for almost 25 years until her retirement. After retirement, she devoted herself to many different activities and hobbies, which included traveling with her sisters, cooking, having family over for cookouts, hosting holiday dinners, baby sitting her grandchildren and great-grandchildren, watching The Price is Right, Family Feud and talking on the phone. There was never a time she didn't pick up the phone to reach out to family, friends, and neighbors for her daily gossip! In 2003, she joined The New Macedonia Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Patrick J. Walker, where she began singing with The Faithful Gospel Choral Ensemble until her health prevented her from attending.

Allean was preceded in death by her husband, Casper Shell; siblings, Louell Brown, James Brown, NB Brown, William Brown, Inez Mincey, Amy Blocker and Elfair Wash.
